IMET2000 Signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Military Medical Unit (Presidential Motorcade)

This agreement aims to support and implement joint programmes that focus on supporting the Military Medical Unit (Presidential Motorcade) and empowering them with their practical skills through various training programmes and workshops.

Both parties convened, shared their visions, and officially signed the MoU at the Military Medical Unit Centre in Ramallah. Mr. Fady Zaben represented IMET2000-Pal, while Dr. Manaf Ismail Abu Shamala and Mr. Allam Al-Saqqa represented the Military Medical Unit (Presidential Motorcade).

The agreement primarily focuses on future cooperation strategies between IMET2000 and the Military Medical Unit, aligning with shared visions. This collaboration aims to train and enhance the practical skills of medical staff in the military medical unit. It also seeks to broaden cooperation opportunities through various training programmes and workshops provided by IMET2000.





IMET2000 Signed a Memorandum of Understanding with Patient's Friends Society / Al-Amal Hospital-Jenin

This agreement between IMET2000-Pal and Patient's Friends Society/Al-Amal Hospital aims to support and carry out cooperative activities that, through a variety of training sessions and workshops, centre on assisting the medical staff and providing them with their practical skills.



At the IMET2000-Pal Centre in Ramallah, both sides met, discussed their goals, and formally signed the MoU. Mr. Fady Zaben represented IMET2000-Pal, while Ms. Ghada Hasan represented the Patient's Friends Society/Al-Amal Hospital-Jenin.


IMET2000 Held Research Education Programme in Collaboration with the Arab American University


The International Medical Education Trust 2000 and the Arab American University organised a successful lecture series through their Research Education Programme in 2024, aimed at improving research and clinical skills among faculty in medicine, nursing, and health professions.



Led by Dr. Malik Zaben, CEO of IMET2000 and Dean at the university, the series included three Zoom sessions. The first, on February 29, covered clinical auditing and research design. On March 3, session focused on research methodologies and statistical analysis, while the final lecture on March 10 addressed academic writing and publication strategies.

Over 60 faculty members participated, benefiting from the knowledge shared and the opportunity to engage with peers. Dr. Zaben emphasised the initiative's role in enhancing medical education and research in Palestine, reflecting IMET2000's dedication to healthcare improvement.







IMET2000 Organised Advanced Cardiovascular Life Support Training Workshop at IMET2000-Pal Training Centre

IMET2000-Pal held a workshop covering advanced cardiopulmonary resuscitation on 10 & 11/3/2024, attended by 6 doctors and nurses from different hospitals. It was titled:

Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) Course for Physicians and Nurses

The workshop aimed to educate participants on crucial aspects such as managing respiratory and cardiac arrest, symptomatic bradycardia, airway and stroke management, and relevant pharmacology. Additionally, it emphasised fostering effective communication and leadership skills within an ACLS team. The training, conducted by a certified instructor from the American Heart Association, involved the use of medical dolls for hands-on practice in advanced cardiac resuscitation techniques. The session concluded with an assessment to gauge the trainees' proficiency in handling emergency cases.









IMET2000 Organised Trauma Evaluation and Management (TEAM) Training in Collaboration with Palestinian Medical Students' Association (PMSA)

IMET2000-Pal has supported the Palestinian Medical Students' Association (PMSA) through training grants for its participants in the Trauma Evaluation and Management (TEAM) programme, which focuses on injury assessment and management and is accredited by the American College of Surgeons. The training was held at the IMET2000-Pal Training Centre on Friday, 8/3/2024, and was attended by 16 medical students. It was conducted under the supervision of Advanced Trauma Life Support (ATLS) instructors.



The session addressed incidents that demand rapid injury assessment and appropriate interventions to save patients' lives. The workshop employed comprehensive simulations based on real-life scenarios and followed the recommendations of the American College of Surgeons. As a result of the training, participants acquired the ability to promptly and accurately assess the conditions of injured patients. They also learned to determine the correct priorities for assessing and resuscitating patients. Furthermore, participants gained experience in collaborative care for injured patients during their transfer to the hospital.







IMET2000 Organised Three Basic Life Support Training Workshops in this Month

IMET2000-Pal in cooperation with the Arab American University and the Modern University Collage Heart Centres organised THREE training workshops attended by 28 doctors and nurses from governmental, private hospitals, and Military Medical Unit on:

Critical Core Training: Basic Life Support (BLS) Training for Healthcare Professionals

The workshops took place at the IMET2000-Pal Training Centre and Military Medical Unit. These trainings aimed to provide instructions and practical sessions about adult, children and infants Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillation (AED). They were led by certified instructors from the American Heart Association (AHA).
