MET2000 Signs a Memorandum of Understanding with the Palestinian EMTs and Paramedics Council

IMET2000 has signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with the Palestinian EMTs and Paramedics Council at IMET2000-Pal Training Centre in Ramallah. The signing was attended by representatives from both parties, including Mr Fady Zaben and Dr Ahmed Rajoub from IMET2000-Pal, and Mr Manwar Al Ghafiyan and Mr Saeed Besher from the Council.

The agreement aims to enhance the quality and effectiveness of emergency and primary healthcare services in Palestine by equipping paramedics and emergency care providers with advanced skills and knowledge. This will be achieved through specialised training programmes, practical life-saving workshops, and traumafocused courses.

This MoU represents a major step forward in empowering Palestinian first responders, enabling them to save lives and protect their communities every day.



IMET2000-Pal Hosts Trauma Evaluation and Management Course (TEAM™) Accredited by the American College of Surgeons



With trauma cases a daily challenge in Palestine, IMET2OOO-Pal organised the Trauma Evaluation and Management (TEAM™) course, accredited by the American College of Surgeons, on 25 September 2O25 at IMET2OOO-Pal Training Centre in Ramallah.

Twelve nurses and paramedics participated in an intensive programme that blended interactive lectures, video demonstrations, case-based discussions, and practical skills training. By introducing international standards for rapid trauma assessment and management, the course equips frontline healthcare workers with the confidence to make life-saving decisions under pressure, strengthening Palestine's capacity to save lives when it matters most.

This reflects IMET2000's course commitment to empowering Palestinian medical teams to face the urgent challenges of emergency, trauma, critical care.







IMET 2000 Supports Gazan Medical Students at Oxford Summer School

IMET2000 continues its mission to advance medical education in Palestine by providing grants for aspiring doctors unique international access opportunities. This summer. medical students from the Gaza Strip were sponsored by IMET2000 to participate in the Oxford University Summer School, reflecting IMET2000's commitment to providing meaningful learning experiences that broaden academic and professional horizons.

The programme gave the students the chance to interact with professors and peers from around the world, explore the latest medical technologies, and practise on advanced simulation models, experiences that significantly strengthened their scientific and professional skills.

IMET2000 Conducts Two "Stop the Bleed" Courses for Medical Students at Arab American University Palestine



In an inspiring step towards preparing the next generation of healthcare professionals, IMET2000-Pal, in cooperation with Arab American University Palestine (AAUP), delivered two "Stop the Bleed" workshops for the third year medical students. The sessions took place on 8 September at Jenin Campus and 15 September at Al-Rihan Campus - AAUP, with a total of 37 students participating. The workshops aimed to equip future doctors with the skills required to respond effectively to life-threatening bleeding, whether in clinical environments or everyday situations.

During the workshops, students engaged in both theoretical learning and practical exercises using high-fidelity mannequins, mastering essential bleeding control techniques such as wound compression, wound packing, and tourniquet application.

Participants praised the workshops for their practical content and hands-on approach, describing the experience as "exceptional and pivotal" in boosting their confidence and readiness to act in real-life emergencies. The workshops were led by accredited American College of Surgeons instructors.

IMET2000-Pal Equips Healthcare Professionals with Life-Saving Skills



Recognising the vital importance of immediate response in saving lives, IMET2000-Pal conducted two specialised training workshops titled:

"Critical Core Training: Basic Life Support (BLS) Training for Healthcare Professionals."

The sessions were held on **3 September** at An-Najah Heart Centre and on **15 September** at IMET2000-Pal Training Centre in Ramallah, attended by 18 doctors and nurses.

The workshops aim to provide essential theoretical knowledge and practical skills in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) for adults, children, and infants, as well as training on the safe and effective use of Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs).

The trainings were delivered by certified instructors accredited by the American Heart Association (AHA), ensuring participants received up-to-date, standardised instruction in line with international guidelines.





Palestinian Medical Students Gain Clinical Experience in the United States Supported by IMET2000

IMET2000-Pal supported two Palestinian medical students, Mr Baraa Diab and Mr Mohammed Rabaiaa from Jenin City, in completing an advanced clinical training programme in Haematology & Oncology at the University of Kansas Medical Centre.
