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Professor Colin James Green (1935–2026)

Professor Colin James Green was a pioneering medical scientist, educator, and humanitarian whose career was driven by a commitment to advancing science and improving healthcare worldwide. From his early research in organ transplantation and immunology to his pioneering work in tissue regeneration and surgical innovation, he authored **more than 500 scientific publications**. He helped shape modern transplant medicine through groundbreaking research.

Believing that education was the foundation of better healthcare, Professor Green **founded the International Medical Education Trust (IMET2000) in 2000**. Through IMET2000, he championed international partnerships that strengthened medical education, research, and clinical training across Eastern Europe, the Middle East, Asia, and Africa. His vision led to the establishment of research and training initiatives, including a health sciences research centre in Ramallah and healthcare projects that expanded access to quality medical services in underserved communities.

His dedication to Palestine was especially profound. **He played a pivotal role in establishing the first Faculty of Medicine at Al-Quds University in 1994**, served as a Visiting Professor, and remained a steadfast advocate for Palestinian healthcare and medical education. In recognition of his outstanding contributions, **he was awarded the Palestinian Millennium Medal in 2002**.

Professor Green's legacy lives on through IMET2000, the institutions he founded, the healthcare professionals he mentored, and the countless lives improved through his vision, leadership, and unwavering belief that education and collaboration can transform healthcare.

IMET2000 Delivers Advanced Cardiac Life Support Training for Physicians and Nurses



Strengthening emergency care skills and advancing healthcare excellence, IMET2000-Pal conducted an Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) Training Workshop on June 2-3, 2026, at the IMET2000-Pal Training Centre. The workshop brought together six doctors and nurses from various hospitals to enhance their competencies in managing critical and life-threatening emergencies.

The workshop covered essential topics including respiratory and cardiac arrest management, symptomatic bradycardia, airway management, stroke care, related pharmacology, and effective communication and leadership within an ACLS team.



Delivered by a certified instructor from Modern University College (MUC) - American Heart Association, the training combined theoretical learning with hands-on practice using medical manikins to strengthen participants' advanced resuscitation skills.

IMET2000 Organises “Trauma Evaluation and Management” Training Course for Nursing Students at Al Rawda University College

With trauma cases a daily challenge in Palestine, IMET2000-Pal organised the Trauma Evaluation and Management (TEAM™) course, accredited by the American College of Surgeons, on 10 June 2026 at IMET2000-Pal Training Centre in Ramallah.

Fifteen nurses from Al Rawda University College participated in an intensive training that blended interactive lectures, video demonstrations, case-based discussions, and practical skills training. By introducing international standards for rapid trauma assessment and management, the course equips frontline healthcare workers with the confidence to make life-saving decisions under pressure, strengthening Palestine's capacity to save lives when it matters most.

This course reflects IMET2000's commitment to empowering Palestinian nurses to face the urgent challenges of emergency, trauma, and critical care.



IMET2000 Conducts Two Basic Life Support Training Workshops in June

IMET2000-Pal conducted two Basic Life Support (BLS) workshops in June 2026, engaging a total of 18 healthcare professionals and providing them with practical, hands-on training to enhance their ability to respond to critical situations.

The training focused on building both knowledge and practical confidence in managing emergencies. Participants received hands-on practice in cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) for adults, children, and infants, alongside training on the safe and effective use of Automated External Defibrillators (AEDs).

The first workshop took place on 15 June at Friends Medical for Health Creativity Centre in Nablus, while the second session was held on 24 June at IMET2000-Pal Training Centre in Ramallah.

Both workshops were delivered by instructors certified by the American Heart Association (AHA), ensuring participants received up-to-date, standardised training aligned with international guidelines.

These workshops reflect IMET2000's continued commitment to strengthening emergency care skills among healthcare professionals and enhancing their readiness to respond effectively in critical situations

IMET2000 Supports Emergency Nursing Master's Research through Accredited "Stop the Bleed" Training

As part of its commitment to advancing nursing research and healthcare education, IMET2000 supported Emergency Nursing Master's student "Mr Mahmoud Salman" in conducting his Master's research thesis on:

"The impact of bleeding-control training on nursing students' knowledge and attitudes".

As the only accredited provider of Stop the Bleed training in Palestine, IMET2000 played a key role in enabling the successful implementation of the study by conducting a series of Stop the Bleed workshops involving more than 90 nursing students. The training equipped participants with essential life-saving skills while generating valuable data for the research.

This support shows IMET2000's commitment to supporting nurses, promoting evidence-based practice, and strengthening healthcare education and training in Palestine.

Mr Salman extended his appreciation to IMET2000 for its support, which contributed to the successful implementation of the research study and the development of evidence-based healthcare education.



IMET2000 Holds Paediatric Advanced Life Support Training Workshop for Healthcare Professionals



As part of its ongoing training activities, IMET2000-Pal held a “Paediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS) Training Workshop for Healthcare Professionals” on 29-30 June 2026 at the An-Najah Training Centre in Nablus, with the participation of six doctors and nurses from various governmental and private hospitals in the West Bank.

The workshop was delivered by Dr Eman AlShaweesh, a certified instructor by the American Heart Association (AHA).

The training focused on key components of paediatric emergency care, including updates from the American PALS guidelines. Participants engaged in practical sessions covering the paediatric systematic approach, high-quality CPR for infants and children, management of respiratory and cardiac emergencies, and early intervention strategies. The course also included training in multi-rescuer resuscitation techniques and team dynamics.
